3. Description and intended use of the packaging materials

This technical documentation applies to the transport packaging for chipboard manufactured and marketed by Koskisen Oyj. The packaging is designed for the protection, handling, storage, and transportation of chipboard.

6. Assessment of PPWR requirements

Heavy metals (Article 5(4))

Under Article 5(4), the sum of the concentrations of lead, cadmium, mercury and hexavalent chromium in the packaging or its components must not exceed 100 mg/kg. Based on the assessment of the packaging covered by this technical documentation, the requirements of Article 5(4) are met.

Substance restrictions, PFAS (Article 5(5))

The PFAS restrictions under Article 5(5) apply to packaging intended for food contact. The packaging covered by this technical documentation is intended for the transport of chipboard and is not intended for food contact. The PFAS requirements under Article 5(5) therefore do not apply to this packaging.

Recyclable packaging (Article 6)

Under Article 6, packaging placed on the market must be designed for material recycling. During the transition period, the assessment has applied the standard EN 13430:2004, on the basis of which the packaging covered by this technical documentation can be considered to meet the requirements of Article 6.

Packaging minimisation (Article 10)

Under Article 10, packaging must be designed so that its weight and volume are limited to the minimum necessary to ensure its functionality. During the transition period, the assessment has applied the standard EN 13428:2004. On this basis, the packaging covered by this technical documentation meets the requirements of Article 10.
